PITATE is the name of the flower drawn by the illustrator Yiling Changues, who lives and works in Tahiti. Also called Jasmine of Tahiti, it is found in many Polynesian gardens for its very appreciated smell. It is a tribute to the artist's grandmother, a great lover of flowers and plants, who passed on this passion to her at an early age and who influences her artistic work today. Worked in hand-tuft, mixing New Zealand wool cut and loop pile, this rug is an ode to the enchanting flora of the artist's islands.
