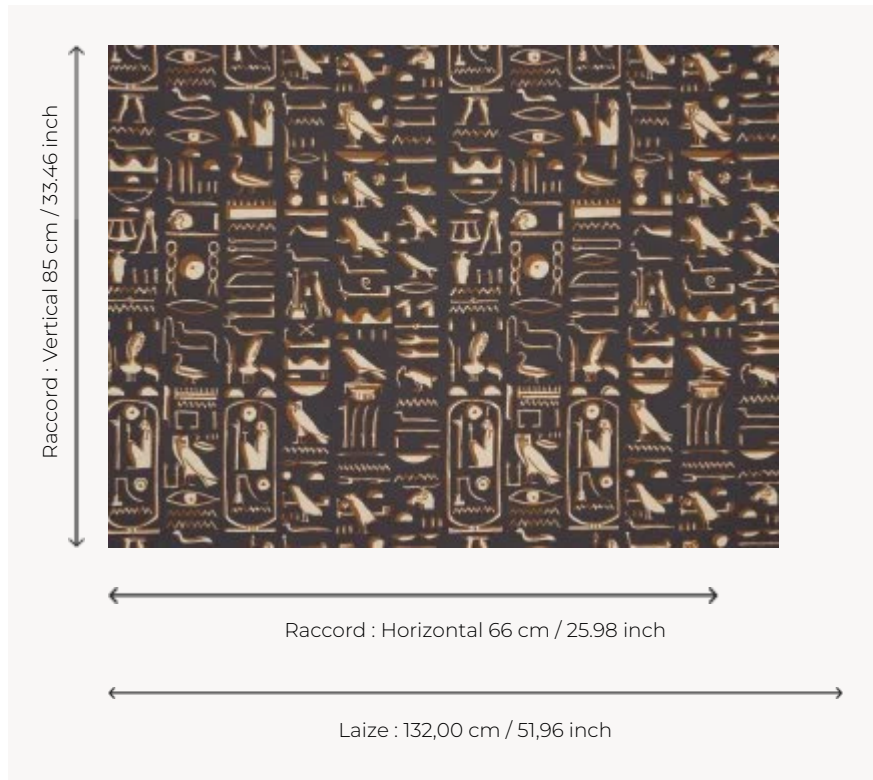


## F3665001 TANIS

In ancient Egypt, the obelisk was mainly used in sacred architecture. Dedicated to the sun god and Pharaoh Ramses II, the hieroglyphs of this jacquard are woven and interpreted in light and shadow.

These inscriptions are extracted from the characters engraved on the Obelisk of the Place de la Concorde in Paris, a monolithic monument that has fascinated people since its arrival in France in 1833. Coordinated with FP899 TANIS wallpaper. Woven in Maison Pierre Frey's workshops in northern France.
