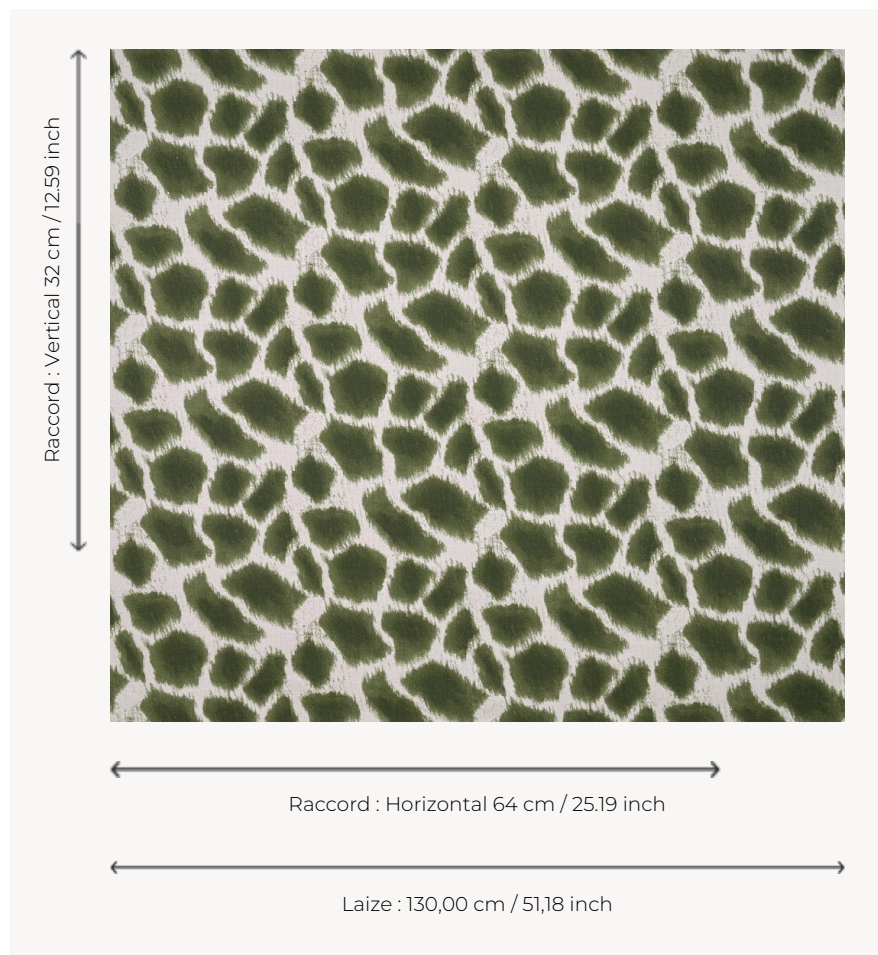


## T0670001 GIRAFFE

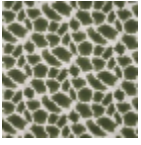
