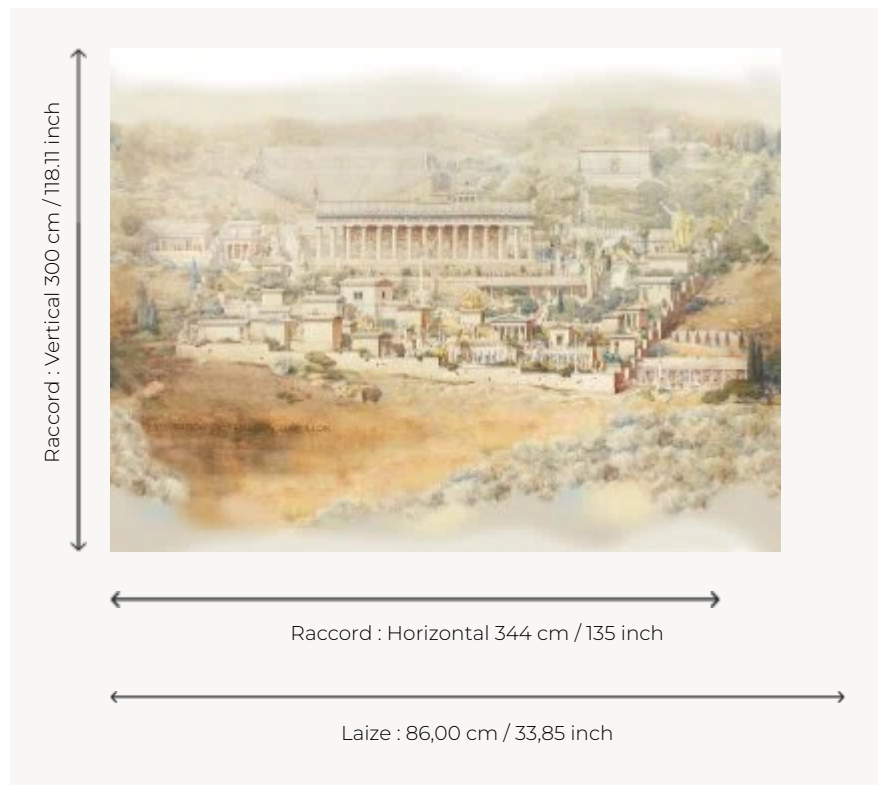


## FP989001 APOLLON

Printed on a textile support with subtle metallic reflections pasted on a non-woven fabric evoking tapestries.
